Samuel Game - Clockmaker of Milborne Port

The discovery of a grandfather clock belonging to Edward Hallett of Swatchford led to further research into local clockmakers with a view to discovering who made it. One possibility was local clockmaker Samuel Game who was born around 1702 in Milborne Port; he married Judith West in 1727.

Samuel and Judith had many children! Their great-great granddaughter inherited an 8-day clock case in 1829. Perhaps it was this one...
