
The Prankerds – We are very interested in the inscriptions on the plaques, gravestones and chest tombs in St John's church and in the churchyard. This set of inscriptions on a chest tomb on the south side of the church is of particular interest because of the picture that it paints of the generosity of these men – Thomas Prankerd, who was buried in 1609, and his descendant James Prankerd, buried in 1699. These sums of £40 and £60 are equivalent to about £7700 and £8600 now; these sums, and the fact that the family could afford a chest tomb, reflect the wealth, status and charitable inclinations of the Prankerd family – and the inclusion of these details on the tomb also shows that the family wanted other people to know about them! Why not go and have a look for yourself? The Prankerd Charity is still in existence!

borne Port the interest of 60 pounds to be paid unto them in Christmas week yearly

for ever at ye discretion of Edward, John and Thomas brothers of ye sd James Prankerd

and Edward Prankerd their kinsman in whose hands ye sd 60 pounds is to remain so long as

they shall live and when it shall please God that either of them shall dy the survivors

of him so dying shall proceed to choose another of ye sm name in his stead
